



# Irish Shows Association Child Safeguarding Statement

#### Section 1

<u>The Irish Shows Association</u> is the Governing Body for agricultural shows in Ireland. Agricultural shows provide various activities and opportunities for young people through participation in local, regional and national level.

## Section 2 - Principles to safeguard children from harm

**Dunmanway Agricultural Show** is committed to safeguarding children and by working under the guidance of our Safeguarding Policies our volunteers throughout the organisation, seek to create a safe environment for young people to grow and develop.t. The following set of principles should be adhered to:

- **Importance of childhood** The importance of childhood should be understood and valued by everyone involved in shows.
- Needs of the child All children's activities and experiences in competition should be guided by what is best for children. This means that adults should have a basic understanding of the emotional, physical and personal needs of young people.
- Integrity in relationships Adults interacting with children in shows are in a position of trust and influence. They should always ensure that children are treated with integrity and respect, and the self-esteem of young people is enhanced.
- Fair Play All children's activities and competitions should be conducted in an atmosphere of fair play. The principles of fair play should always be emphasised, and organisers should give clear guidelines regarding acceptable standards of behaviour.
- Quality atmosphere & ethos Children's involvement should be conducted in a safe, positive and encouraging atmosphere.
- Competition Competition is an essential element of agricultural shows and should be encouraged in an age-appropriate manner. A child centred ethos will help to ensure that competition and specialisation are kept in their appropriate place.
- **Equality** All children should be valued and treated in an equitable and fair manner regardless of ability, age, gender, religion, social and ethnic background or political persuasion.

### Section 4 - Procedures

Our Child Safeguarding Statement has been developed in line with requirements under the Children First Act 2015, (the Children First: National Guidance, and Tusla's Child Safeguarding: A Guide for Policy, Procedure & Practice and the Children (NI) Order 1995). In addition to our Risk Assessment document described above, there are further procedures that support our intention to safeguard children while they are availing of our activities.

<u>Irish Shows Association National Governing Body for shows</u> has the following procedures in place as part of our Safeguarding Policies:

- Procedures for the management of allegations of abuse or misconduct by volunteers against a child availing of our activities.
- Procedures for the safe recruitment of volunteers to work with children in our activities.
- Procedures for access to child safeguarding training and information, including the identification of the occurrence of harm.
- Procedure for reporting of child protection or welfare concerns to Statutory Authorities.
- Procedure for maintaining a list of the persons (if any) in the relevant service who are mandated persons.
- Procedure for appointing a relevant person.

The Mandated/Relevant Person for *Horse Sport Ireland* is *Paul Hayes*.

## Section 5 – Implementation

We recognise that implementation is an ongoing process. The Irish Shows Association is committed to the implementation of this Child Safeguarding Statement and the procedures that support our intention to keep children safe from harm while availing of our activities.
